> > (2) _____; truth. "that you may know the **certainty** of those things in which you were instructed" (Luke 1:4)

2. Two Types of Evidence

- 1) ______ that which can be tested and repeated under scientific controls.
 - Truths about God are not typically proven with scientific evidence.
- 2) ______ that which is shown to be beyond a reasonable doubt based on oral and written testimony and based on other exhibits like photographs, archeological findings, and corroborated accounts of history.
 - Truths about God can be shown to be true based on legal-historical evidence.
 - The Bible is a written testimony from God, which is the source of our assurance with regard to spiritual truth.
