The purpose of the Sermon was to <u>instruct</u> those who believed on Christ as Messiah and to <u>condemn</u> those who had not yet done so.
Jesus raises the level of righteousness from a relative <u>human</u> standard to a <u>divine</u> standard
Jesus shows that mankind <u>cannot reach</u> this level of righteousness
For those who have accepted Jesus as the Messiah, it puts forth the righteous principles
to be employed by faith as Jews until the kingdom is set up.
Matthew 5:27-30 is the second of six units that begin "You have heard that it was said, but I say to you"
1. Jesus gives the <u>Traditional Interpretation</u> (5:27)
a. The oral traditions of the Scribes and Pharisees the written commandment found in the Mosaic Law – 5:27
